

It's time to start over again. The Christian year begins on the first Sunday of Advent. We begin our year-long celebration of our Savior by waiting...expectantly. Waiting expectantly is something we don't do very well in our 21st century culture. We've arrived at the age of the instantaneous. It started with instant potatoes and instant pudding but has moved swiftly to instant global access to all information, commerce, and the fulfillment of any and all needs, desires and whims. So, Advent is the perfect time to overcome our "need-for-speed." I think we people-of-faith would do well to reconnect with our ancient tradition of waiting; to recapture a watchful-waiting disposition instead of rushing headlong into all the "things" our culture calls "Christmas."

For the Christian Church, it is not yet "Christmas." In these days before December 25th we are about the business of making room in our hearts and lives for Christ to dwell. It's not the decorations and baking and holiday music and shopping that make us ready to receive the 'Child King'. It is, throughout the days of Advent, that we have opportunity to experience and increasing awareness that our only hope can only be in Christ, the Son of God, coming to us in person.

So, hold back; let the sense of expectancy build.

In the coming weeks, we will light candles during worship to remind us of the meaning of Christ's coming. This Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent, we will light the first candle, the candle of hope. For truly, Jesus is the only hope for the world. One can only cultivate the hope of faith, while in need of it.

Next week we will light the candle of peace. Christ came to bring peace to the world. Scripture calls Him the "Prince of Peace." Christ's method for bringing peace is by reconciling hearts and lives to God. It is only when we are in step with God's intended purpose for each life that one achieves inner peace. The world is made peaceful as peaceful believers bring their inner peace to life in the world.

The third candle is that of joy. The candle of joy reminds us of the state of inner contentment that occurs when Christ arrives in the life of a believer. When Christ is received by an individual, the Spirit of Christ begins a process of transformation of that heart, such that joy becomes the new norm.

On the fourth Sunday of Advent we will light the candle of love. The motivating force of God coming to us in the person of Jesus of Nazareth, is God's deep, selfless, abiding love for each of us. God loves us! We need God! God came! God still comes to us!

The final candle is the Christ candle. It is the candle that represents the glorious birth for which we have been preparing. The great gift of God, Jesus Christ, God's Son is finally here. It is time to celebrate! Christmas begins!

I hope our lighting of the candles of the advent wreath will be a cue for you each week to focus your devotion, attention, and prayer on the hope, peace, joy, and love that comes in the person of Christ, our Lord. Christ is coming...get ready!

100 Days of Prayer Update

It's been almost 100 days since 40+ members of our congregation committed themselves to gather in groups of three for prayer. Our goal was to prayerfully seek God's vision for the future of Calvary Baptist Church.

It is now time to consider some of the insights we may have received over the course of those 100 days of intensive seeking.

I'm unsure what to expect from our collective insights. Some may have been expecting God to deliver an explosive detailed message of plans programs, organizations, and ministries that are designed to fill our pews on Sunday mornings. On the other end of the spectrum, others may have simply thought, "Prayer...it couldn't hurt."

My own expectations for the resulting reports/ideas/insights from the prayer triplets were that our confidence in the power of prayer would grow; that our closeness and confidence in each other would grow; that we would grow in our ability to look objectively at how Calvary Baptist Church is living Christ's Gospel; that we might be ready to ask difficult questions of ourselves without fear; that we would be ready move courageously in the direction of God's leading; that we would be better at listening, seeing, and feeling where God is moving; and, most of all, that we would be closer to God.

In thinking about the feedback from our prayer triplets, I thought the best way to *prepare* was through "*pre-prayer*". This is my prayer:

God help me to be submissive to Your leadership. Help me to be authentic; both with myself and my church family. Help me to put my own agendas and even feelings aside so that I may be free to follow You wherever you lead. Help me to listen to You speaking through my Calvary Brothers and Sisters; to hear beyond words. Help me to hear, to see, and to sense the direction You have already laid out in Your mind's eye for Calvary Baptist Church.

God, help me to be content with Your time-table; to not rush ahead or lag behind; to not count waiting with expectation as "wasted" time; to not be anxious when clarity is absent but confident that in Your time all will be plain.

Help me to be a steward of my time, gifts, relationships, opportunities, influence and possessions. Help me to know that I belong to you and everything I count as mine, is yours. So, help me to be a wise steward; to invest in those things that bring You the greatest glory.

God, help me to balance "being" and "doing"; to know that mindfulness of **being** in your presence informs everything I **do** in Your name.

Most of all God, help me to dwell in your divine will. Amen.

That's really what I expect to emerge from my experience with "100 Days of Prayer": that I would be open, hopeful, submissive, courageous, and wise; that, together, we would trust God has everything we need and, if we don't already have it, He will supply.

On page thirty of your prayer guide, you will find instructions to report the "What are the Top Five to Seven Insights About God's Future for Our Congregation Your Triplet Would Like to Share?" Please turn in only one page from each 'prayer triplet' on December 17, 2017. Myself and some congregation leaders will collect your insight and report them to the whole church at a meeting after worship on January 21, 2018 for further reflection.

- Submit only one page of insights from each group.
- The insights should be agreed upon by each member of your prayer triplet.
- Keep them concise. If further explanation is needed, please attach another page.
- You may not be able to agree on the five to seven insights suggested; however, try to have at least one or two you can share.
- Please include the name of your prayer triplet so that we will know who has turned them in.

I look forward to sharing in what God has in store for Calvary Baptist Church!


