From Our Pastor

I'm sure you're aware there is a group from both Colonial Avenue Baptist Church and Calvary Baptist Church who have been meeting to begin considering whether we should combine our efforts and establish a single congregation from two. Reverend Melissa Scott and I have been praying about and discussing such a move for some time. Now, time has come to do some serious seeking.

"Merger" is not a new idea among churches. In fact, as many congregations have yet to recover from the lack of participation exacerbated by COVID, "merger" has become guite common.

You will notice that in this article, I will use quotations marks around the word "merger". That's important because "merger" is used to describe just too many circumstances under which organizations (in our case congregations) come together.

The reason I chafe so much under the yoke of the "M-word" is I do not think it best describes what I understand God to be placing before us to consider. What we are trying to do is not like two or more corporations negotiating ownership and structure to produce a singular arrangement that is acceptable to the majority stockholders on both sides. I have no interest in any such approach between congregations.

The one huge problem with this approach for churches is one word: OWNERSHIP. When corporations begin to consider "merger" they make an accounting of what belongs to each organization: what do the individual parties own and what's their value.

I suppose this is where I part company with the corporate idea of "merger." If I claim to have Jesus Christ as my forgiver and leader, I now belong to Jesus. Not only to I belong to Jesus; everything I have or ever will have belongs completely to Him. Thus, I own nothing!

If I don't own the things I identify as belonging to me then I certainly don't own anything my church family would think of as an asset. If I have tithed, that tithe never belonged to me and it certainly doesn't belong to me after I have given it. If the things believers own belong to their Savior, how much more do the things we regard as belonging to church, belong to our Savior.

I think the best way to begin considering whether two congregations should join is by first getting into our heads the notion that anything we regard as belonging to "our" church belongs only to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! Jesus does not belong to the church. Jesus IS the Church. (In the words of Elsa, "Let It Go!" (And if you don't know who Elsa is, ask one of your grandkids.))

Let's take that reasoning one step further. If we do not own the church, then whatever happens to it, falls completely under the purview of its head: Christ the Lord. If all those things be true, then the only consideration that need be taken into account is the will and way of Christ.

So, while many may be anxious to begin negotiating a "merger", I don't want to do anything of the sort. I think our first move is for each of us to surrender ownership; surrender ownership of the process; surrender ownership of the outcome. I think the very next thing is to seek Jesus' complete leadership in whatever is next. What "doors" are being opened? What doors are being closed? What am I willing to do for The Kingdom? What is the Spirit leading me to see differently? What will be our "Mission Field"?

So, if you're wondering why all your questions about the "nuts and bolts" of what you may understand "merger" to be between congregations aren't being addressed, I would tell you, "We're not ready yet."

That is primarily what we will be doing on Saturday Morning: asking God what God wants us to do. I don't know what that will be, yet. I'm not prepared to make one more step until our congregations have a genuine sense that the Spirit is moving, regardless of the direction.

I hope you were able to attend the meeting on Saturday at 11 am in the sanctuary at Colonial Avenue Baptist Church as we seek God, together.
