From Our Pastor

As we move forward toward ceasing to exist as two congregations and becoming one new congregation with Colonial Avenue Baptist Church, many of the thoughts I've had through the years about what it means to "BE church" have resurfaced. I thought I would share some of them with you as we stand on the edge of the unknown.

First, is a reaction, to something; during my career, I've heard many times: "Church ought to be "run" like a business". My reaction is, "No! No! No!" Of course, churches should keep precise financial records and maintain confidentiality when it comes to personal giving records. Of course, churches should follow all legal requirements regarding ownership of property and how one relates to employees. Of course, churches should pay their bills on time. There may be a few more similarities, but that's about where the likeness between businesses and churches end.

Churches are, at our core, about ministering the love of Jesus Christ in such a way that others would come to know and love him. That mission takes prescient over any and all other matters. These are the principles that guide all decisions regarding all programs, budgets, personnel, properties, or activities. Nothing is more important. How we do these things, with whom, and for whom are the things for which our God will hold us accountable.

Some like to think of church as nothing more than a benevolent organization. We should just concern ourselves with doing "good". Again, "No! No! No!" Church is about pointing people to Jesus. We must not do anything that does not bring attention to, show the way of, or give glory to our Savior. I frequently ask the question: "How does this move us toward, 'Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done?""

Our commitment to faith in Jesus Christ means, "Saying and doing the things that Jesus did for the same reason that Jesus did them.

As long as the Way of our Savior is our way, we will be moving in the right direction, even when the path is a bit bumpy. One more thing (and this might hurt some feelings). For me, the above priorities also apply to worship, programs, mission activities, faith formation, fellowship, etc. None of these things are about style or what I prefer. I really want to be part of a church family that seeks to be the church in the world; a church that cares more about how we reach people with the love of Christ than what might make us comfortable (or not); a family of God that wants more brothers and sister (whether they 'warm a pew' in our church or not).

Let me close with a little Latin phrase that you will often see in many writings of the ancient church: "soli deo gloria." It basically means, "for the glory of God alone." If we can put that "stamp" on everything we do or say, we will be, "...going into all the world, and preaching the gospel to every creature."

Let us all go in the way and the power of the Spirit of Jesus Christ.

Thursday's meal was pizza, chicken fingers, chips, cookies, fruit and leftover drinks. Kevin Carter and Robert McKinney, along with three folks from Colonial Presbyterian were on-site to serve the workers.

In addition to the food and drinks, we also purchased paper plates, napkins and cups.

Steps to Forming a New Church

As we move forward in forming our new church together, the implementation team recommends the following schedule:

Choosing a Church Name

From July 9-23, we ask for our congregations to submit name suggestions for our new church in the suggestion box in the foyer or by e-mailing info@calvaryroanoke.org or office@cabc.us. The implementation team will prayerfully consider all suggestions and submit two names for vote by the congregation. That vote will take place August 6-13, by placing ballots in the provided box in the foyer or by e-mail.

Purpose and Mission Discovery Process

Beginning in late August, a skilled coach will guide us through a process of seeking God's specific purpose and mission for our new church. All voices are needed to be part of this process. Everyone is encouraged to participate.

Following this discernment process, the next steps (in mid-late fall) will include making sure all the legalities are taken care of (finances, property, personnel) and establishing church structure, affiliations, bylaws, and procedures.

Each month, we will continue to share more details about the next step of the process.

Summer Worship

This summer, our worship will be focused on Holy Habits: Faith Practices That Help Us Love God and Our Neighbor, Listen to the Spirit, and Become More Like Jesus. Rev Melissa Scott (pastor of Colonial Avenue Baptist Church), Dr. Steven Pollard (pastor of Calvary Baptist Church), and Rev.
